Our Wildlife Rescue Dispatcher - Canada Summer Jobs is a great opportunity for youth to gain hands-on communication experience in a high volume environment, building valuable skills while making a direct impact on urban wildlife welfare. This team's primary goal is to respond promptly to inquiries about injured and orphaned wildlife while educating the public on reducing risks to wildlife in urban areas. Program dates run from April 28, 2025 to August 31, 2025. Exact hours and length of placements are not known until granted and announced by the Canada Summer Jobs program.

Compensation:

\$17.40 per hour, increasing to the new minimum wage in BC on June 1, 2025.
